

2022 Fargo Drifting Points Series

Back for 2022, Fargo Drifting will be holding a tandem battle points series. The battles will be held the Saturday of each Drifting The Plains weekend: Saturday, April 23rd, June 4th, August 13th and September 3rd.

To be eligible for competition, you must purchase a weekend drifting pass for the event, pass technical inspection, and be an approved driver. Driver approval will be based on driver skill level demonstrated on the course. Drivers without proper tandem skills/experience may not be allowed to compete. There are no additional fees to compete. This competition is for grassroots and ProAm drivers only.

If you have competed in an FD Pro1 or Pro2/ProSpec event in the last 10 years, you are not eligible to compete.

All competitions will be single elimination, and pairings will be via chip draw. Points will be awarded based on finishing position. Each driver's TOP THREE event finishes will count toward the season points championship. If you compete in all four events, your lowest score will be dropped. You can miss ONE event and not have it count negatively toward your season points total.

Winner – 50

Runner Up – 45

Third – 40

Fourth – 35

Quarter Finals – 30

Round of 16 – 25

Round of 32 – 20

Round of 64 – 15

For each round of competition won, the driver will earn an additional one point. The winner of the 3rd/4th place battle will not get a round win point.

Each competition day, awards will be given to the top four finishers. At the end of the year, cash awards will be given to the top three finishers in the points series:

-First place in the points series - \$1000

-Second place in the points series - \$750

-Third place in the points series - \$500

-Fourth Place in the points series - \$250

-Fifth Place in the points series - \$100

In the event of a points tie, tiebreakers will go in the following order:

1. Head-to-head record
2. Best event finish
3. Second best event finish
4. Third best event finish

As with all DTP events, we will have two run groups throughout the day, with run groups lasting one hour. One run group will include the competition drivers, the other will not. To keep drive time higher, the competition will take place over 2-4 run groups, so the competition doesn't take up the entire drive session, and eliminated drivers can get back on the track.
